WHO IS PAT WARNER?

Pat Warner will be the guest speaker for October. The format will be a bit different. Steve will email Pat questions and Pat will answer them. Steve will start a new thread for the questions.

Age 71, resides in Escondido, California. He has a science degree (B.Sc.) in Oceanography and 40+ years self-taught woodworking experience. His practice is a daily study of the art of routing & drilling. He makes some furniture to maintain his skills. He also makes jigs & fixtures, and the jigs and fixtures to make products, some 30 different router subbases and accessories.

He is fluent in acrylic, aluminum, phenolic, wood, plywood, MDF, miscellaneous substrates, and English.

He has worked with the industry studying router bits, prototyping new routers, and often evaluates new accessories. He has worked with attorneys of major tool manufacturers on patent infringement and injury litigation vis-a-vis routers and routing issues. He has taught routing to more than 2000 students in the college and seminar settings and he teaches one-on-one regularly.

He has written 4 books on routing and has had more than 65 router, routing, and furniture articles published. The [Router Woodworking website](#) is >14 years old. Pat is recognized as a routing expert and has commented that every routing procedure can be reduced to the safe and efficient while maintaining quality.
